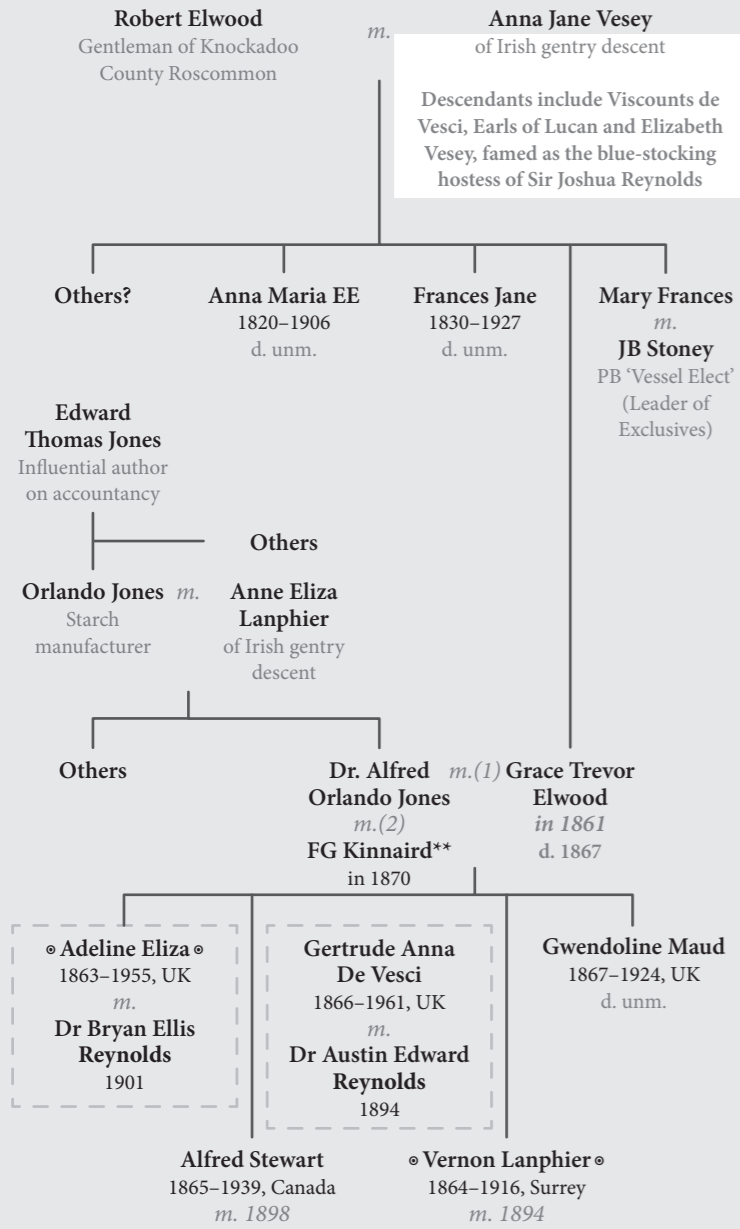


Jones and Elwood* outline tree with Reynolds and Kinnaird connections



Notes

In 1871 Gertrude Anna De Vesci Jones, Gwendoline M Jones and Alfred S Jones were all living with their unmarried maternal aunt Anna MEE Elwood, and the two sisters were still with their aunt in 1881 recorded as Joneses. But from about 1890 all three were using the surname Elwood consistently. In 1881 on the other hand Adeline E Jones and Vernon L Jones were with their father and his second wife, and were consistently Jones thereafter.

* These two were by oral tradition illegitimate children of FG Kinnaird, who had numerous children by AOJ after marriage.

Those children, after her marriage to AOJ, were:

1. Lt (Alfred) Ivan Jones 1871–1919, won MC
2. Arthur Jones 1874–1916, kia WWI
3. Frederica Jones 1881–1930, Spinster
4. Capt. Charles Ruthven Jones 1882–1950, Scots Guards

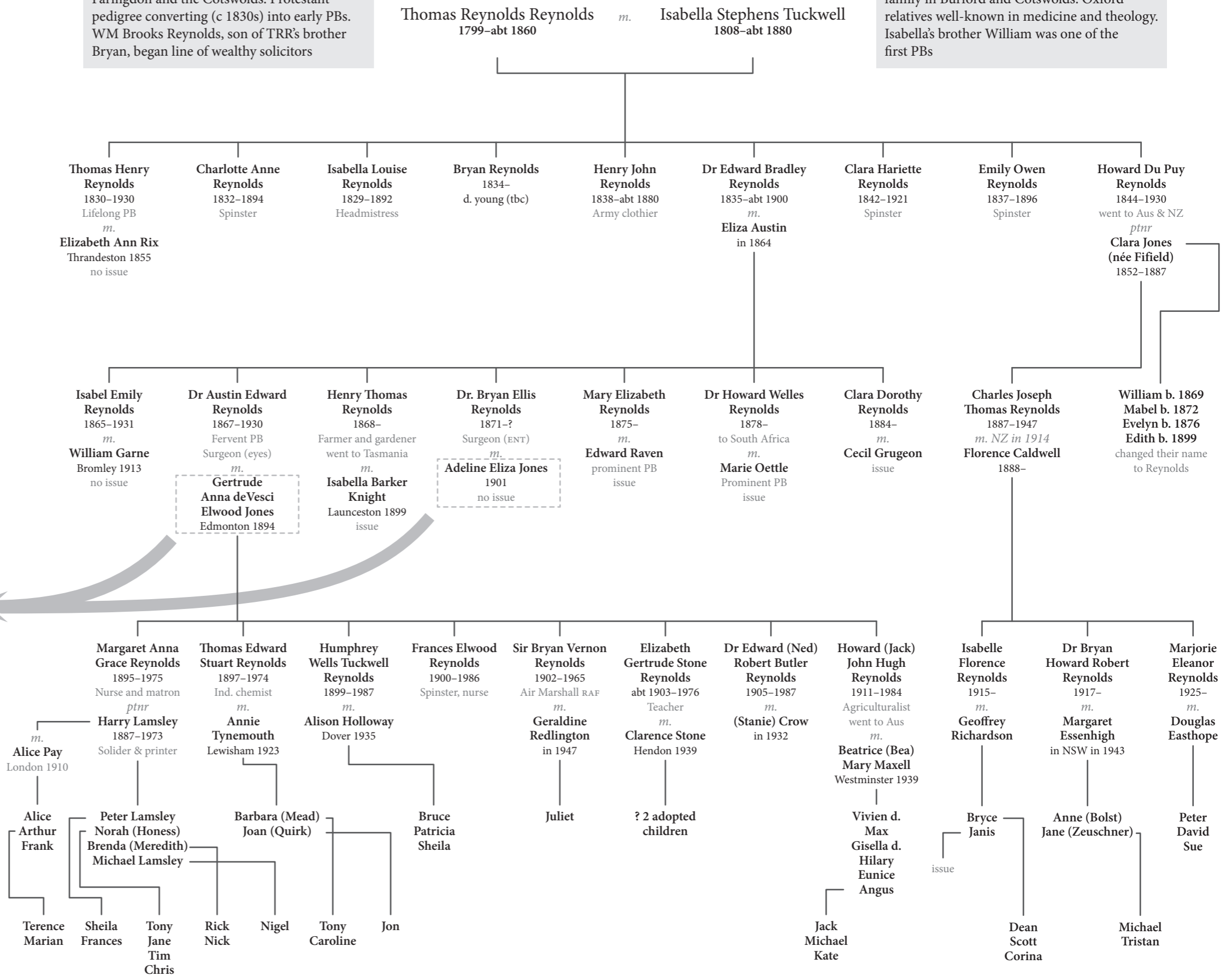
* The Elwood surname is also often spelled Ellwood. However, to maintain consistency, we have kept to the single 'l' alternative.

** Hon. Frederica Georgina Kinnaird was eldest daughter of the 10th Baron Kinnaird of Rossie Priory Scotland, Pall Mall and Bromley, Kent. After converting to the PBs and her marriage to AOJ, she wished herself to be known as Mrs Freida Jones. She died 1929 and left a will.
