# NOTICE.

In committing to the Lord for the use of His saints this second part of the translation of the Old Testament, little need be added to the Introductory Notice which accompanied the First Part, and to which the reader is referred. The same principles have been followed.

The parallel parts in Kings and Chronicles have been compared, so that the characteristic differences might be readily noticed; and, within the limits already stated, the orthography of the proper names has been kept as uniform as possible.

The next Part is in hand, and will, it is hoped, bring the work down to the end of the Canticles.

and over Benjamin, and over all Is10 rael. Ishbosheth Saul's son was
forty years old when he began to
reign over Israel, and he reigned two

years. However, the house of Judah

David was king in Hebron over the
house of Judah was seven years and

six months.

And Abner the son of Ner, and the servants of Ishbosheth the son of Saul, went out from Mahanaim to Gibeon. And Joab the son of Zeruiah.

And they met together by the pool of Gibeon; and they sat down, these on the one side of the pool, and those on the other side of the pool.

And Abner said to Joab, Let the young men now arise and make sport before us. And Joab said, Let them arise. And they arose and went over by number, twelve for Benjamin, and for Ishbosheth the son of Saul, and twelve of the ser16 vants of David. And they caught

And thy servant is in the midst of thy people which thou hast chosen, a great people, that cannot be numbered nor counted for multitude. Give therefore to thy servant an understanding heart to

good and bad; for who is able to judge this thy numerous people? And the word pleased Jehovah, that Solomon had asked this thing. 11 And God said to him, Because thou hast asked this thing, and hast not asked for thyself long life, neither hast asked riches for thyself, nor hast

And Jehovah said to Solomon, Forasmuch as this is done by thee, and thou hast not kept my covenant and my statutes which I commanded thee, I will certainly rend the kingdom from thee, and 12 will give it to thy servant: notwithstanding in thy days I will not do it, for David thy father's sake; I will rend it out of the hand of thy son; 18 only. ple who have spoken to me saving. Lighten the yoke which thy father 10 put upon us? And the young men that had grown up with him spoke to him saying, Thus shalt thou say to this people that have spoken to

against Jeram. (Now Joram kept Ramoth-Gilead, he and all Israel, because of Hazsel king of Syria; and king Joram had returned to be healed in Jizreel of the wounds that

the Syrians had given him, when he fought against Hazzel king of Syria.) And Jehu said, If it be your will, let not a fugitive escape out of the city

to go to tell [it] in Jizreel.

And Jehu rode in a chariot and

went to Jizreel; for Joram lay there.
And Ahaziah king of Judah had come

17 down to see Joram. And the watchman stood on the tower in Jizreel,
and saw Jehu's company as he came,
and said, I see a company. And
Joram said, Take a horseman, and
send to meet them, and let him say,

And they made ready his chariot. And Joram king of Israel and Ahaziah king of Judah went out, each in his chariot; and they went out to meet Jehu, and met him in the plot of Naboth the Jizreelite. And it came to pass when Joram saw Jehu, that he said, Is it peace, Jehu? And he said, What peace, so long as the fornications of thy mother Jezebel and her sorceries are so many? Then Joram turned his hand, and fled, and

said to Ahaziah, Treachery, Ahaziah!
And Jehu took his bow in his hand, and smote Jehoram between his arms, and the arrow went out through his heart; and he sank down in his chariot. And he said to Bidkar his captain, Take him up [and] cast him

in the plot of the field of Naboth the Jizreelite. For remember how, when I and thou rode together after Ahab his father, that Jehovah laid this burden upon him: Certainly I have

seen yesterday the blood of Naboth, and the blood of his sens, saith 1 Jehovah; and I will requite thee in this plot, saith 1 Jehovah. And now, take [and] cast him into the plot,

according to the word of Jehovah.

When Ahaziah king of Judah saw [that], he fled by the way of the garden-house. And Jehu followed after him, and said, Smite him also in his chariot. It was on the ascent of Gur, which is by Jibleam. And he servants carried him in a chariot to Jerusalem, and buried him in his

sepulchre with his fathers in the city

And they were exceedingly afraid, and said, Behold, the two kings stood not before him:

We are thy servants, and will do all that thou shalt bid us: we will not make any one king: do what is good in thy sight. And he wrote a letter the second time to them saying, If ye are mine, and will hearken to my voice, take the heads of the men your master's sons, and come to me to Jizreel to-morrow at this time. Now the king's sons. seventy persons, were with the great men of the city, who brought them 7 up. And it came to pass when the letter came to them, that they took the king's sons, and slaughtered seventy persons, and put their heads in baskets, and sent them to him to <sup>8</sup> Jizreel. And a messenger came and told him saying, They have brought the heads of the king's sons. he said, Lay them in two heaps at the entrance of the gate until the morning. And it came to pass in the morning that he went out: and he stood, and said to all the people, Ye are righteous! behold, I conspired against my master and killed 10 him; but who smote all these? And the captains of the hundreds did according to all that Jehoiada the priest commanded; and they took every man his men, those that were to come in on the sabbath, with them that were to go forth on the sabbath, and they came to Jehonada the priest. <sup>10</sup> And the priest gave to the captains

of the hundreds king David's spears and shields which were in the house of Jehovah. And the couriers stood by the king round about, every man with his weapons in his hand, from the right side of the house to the left side of the house, toward the altar

and the house, toward the altar and the house. And he brought forth the king's son, and put the crown upon him, and [gave him] the testimony; and they made him king, and anointed him; and they clapped their hands, and said, Long live the king!

And Athaliah heard the noise of

the couriers [and] of the people; and she came to the people into the house 14 of Jehovah. And she looked, and behold, the king stood on the dais, according to the custom, and the princes and the trumpeters were by the king; and all the people of the land rejoiced, and blew with trumpets.

And Athaliah rent her garments and <sup>16</sup> cried, Conspiracy! Conspiracy! came to pass when they saw that

priest came up, and they tied up and
counted the money that was found
in the house of Jehovah. And they

XIII. In the three-and-twentieth year of Joach the son of Ahaziah, king of Judah, Jehoahaz the son of Jehu began to reign over Israel in Samaria, for seventeen years. And he did evil in the sight of Jehovah, and followed the sins of Jeroboam the son of

Nebat, who made Israel to sin; he departed not from them. And the anger of Jehovah was kindled against Israel, and he delivered them into the hand of Hazael king of Syria, and into the hand of Ben-Hadad the son of Ha-

<sup>4</sup> zael, all those days. (And Jehoahaz besought Jehovah, and Jehovah hearkened to him; for he saw the oppression of Israel, because the king

of Syria oppressed them. And Jehovah gave Israel a saviour, so that they went out from under the hand of the Syrians; and the children of Israel dwelt in their tents as before.

Nevertheless they departed not from the sins of the house of Jeroboam, who made Israel to sin: they walked therein; and there remained also the Asherah in Samaria.) For he had

slept with his fathers, and Jeroboam sat upon his throne; and Joash was buried in Samaria with the kings of

Israel.

And Elisha fell sick of his sickness in which he died. And Joash the king of Israel came down to him, and wept over his face, and said, My father, my father! the chariot of Israel and the horsemen thereof!

And Elisha said to him, Take bow

and arrows. And he took a bow and arrows. And he said to the king of Israel, Put thy hand upon the bow. And he put his hand [upon it]; and Ellisha put his hands upon the king's <sup>17</sup> hands, and said, Open the window

eastward. And he opened [it]. And Elisha said, Shoot. And he shot. And he said, An arrow of Jehovah's deliverance, even an arrow of deliverance from the Syrians; and thou

shalt smite the Syrians in Aphek,

till thou hast consumed [them]. And he said, Take the arrows. And he took [them]. And he said to the king of Israel, Smite upon the ground.

And he smote thrice, and stayed.

him, and said, Thou shouldest have

smitten five or six times; then wouldest thou have smitten the Syrians till thou hadst consumed [them]; whereas now thou shalt smite Syria but thrice.

He smote of Edom in the valley of salt ten thousand, and took Sela in the war, and called the name of it Joktheel to this day.

Then Amaziah sent messengers to Jehoash the son of Jehoahaz, son of Jehu, king of Israel, saying, Come let us look one quetton in the

Come, let us look one another in the face. And Jehoash king of Israel sent to Amaziah king of Judah, saying, The thorn-bush that is in Lebanon sent to the cedar that is in Lebanon, saying, Give thy daughter to my son as wife; and there passed by the wild beast that is in Lebanon, and trode down the thorn-bush. Thou hast indeed smitten Edom, and thy

heart has lifted thee up: boast thyself, and abide at home; for why shouldest thou contend with misfortune, that thou shouldest fall, thou, and Judah with thee? But Amaziah would not hear. And Jehoash king

of Israel went up; and they looked

one another in the face, he and Amaziah king of Judah, at Beth-12 shemesh, which is in Judah. And Judah was routed before Israel; and they fled every man to his tent.

And Jehoash king of Israel took Amaziah king of Judah, the son of Jehoash son of Ahaziah, at Beth shemesh, and came to Jerusalem, and broke down the wall of Jerusalem from the gate of Ephraim to the

corner-gate, four hundred cubits.

And he took all the gold and the silver, and all the vessels that were found in the house of Jehovah, and in the treasures of the king's house, and hostages, and returned to Sa-

maria.

what he did, and his might, and how he fought with Amaziah king of Judah, are they not written in the 18 book of the chronicles of the kings of 16 Israel? And Jehoash slept with his

And Amaziah the son of Joash king of Judah lived after the death of Jehoash son of Jehoahaz, king of Israel,

18 fifteen years. And the rest of the acts of Amaziah, are they not written in the book of the chronicles of the

19 kings of Judah? And they made a conspiracy against him in Jerusalem; and he fled to Lachish: and they sent

after him to Lachish, and slew him 20 there. And they brought him on horses, and he was buried at Jerusalem with his fathers, in the city of David.

And all the people of Judah took

21

Azariah, who was sixteen years old, and made him king instead of his 23 father Amaziah. It was he that built Elath, and restored it to Judah, after the king slept with his fathers.

In the fifteenth year of Amaziah the son of Jossh, king of Judah, Jeroboam the son of Joash, king of Israel, began to reign in Samaria, for <sup>34</sup> forty-one years. And he did evil in the sight of Jehovah: he departed not from any of the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to

95 sin. He restored the border of Isreel from the entrance of Hamath as far as the sea of the plain, according to the word of Jehovah the God of Israel, which he had spoken through his servant Jonah the prophet, the son of Amittai, who was of <sup>36</sup> Gath-Hepher. For Jehovah saw

that the affliction of Israel was very bitter; and that there was not any shut up, nor any left, nor any helper <sup>27</sup> for Israel. And Jehovah had not said that he would blot out the name

of Israel from under the heavens:

But they would not hear, and hardened their necks, like to the neck of their fathers, who did not believe in Jehovah their God. And they rejected his statutes, and his covenant which he had made with their fathers, and his testimonies which he had testified unto them; and they followed vanity and became vain, and [went] after the nations that were round about them, concerning whom Jehovah had charged them that they should not do like them. And they for sook all the commandments of Jehovah their God, and made them molten images, two calves, and made an Asherah, and worshipped all the host of the hea-17 vens, and served Baal; and they caused their sons and their daughters

And Solomon the son of David was strengthened in his kingdom, and Jehovah his God was with him and magnified him exceedingly.

And Solomon spoke to all Israel, to the captains of thousands and of hundreds, and to the judges, and to all the princes of all Israel, the <sup>8</sup> chief fathers; and Solomon, and all

the congregation with him, went to the high place at Gibeon; for there was God's tent of meeting which Moses the servant of Jehovah had

4 made in the wilderness. But the ark of God had David brought up from Kirjath-jearim to the [place] that David had prepared for it; for he had spread a tent for it at Jerusalem.

<sup>5</sup> And the brazen altar that Bezaleel the son of Uri, the son of Hur, had made, was there before the tabernacle of Jehovah; and Solomon and the

congregation sought unto it. Solomon offered there upon the brazen alter before Jehovah which was at the tent of meeting; and he

In that night God appeared to Solomon, and said to him. Ask what <sup>8</sup> I shall give thee. And Solomon said to God, Thou hast shewn unto David

my father great loving-kindness, and hast made me king in his stead. Now, Jehovah Elohim, let thy word unto David my father be firm; for

thou hast made me king over a people numerous as the dust of the earth. 10 Give me now wisdom and knowledge, that I may go out and come in before this people: for who can judge this 11 thy great people? And God said to Solomon, Because this was in thy

heart, and thou hast not asked riches. wealth, or honour, nor the life of them that hate thee, neither yet hast asked long life; but hast asked for thyself wisdom and knowledge, that thou mayest judge my people, over whom I have made thee king: wis-

dom and knowledge are granted unto thee; and I will give thee riches and wealth and honour, such as none of the kings have had that have been before thee, neither shall any after thee have the like.

Then Solomon came back b [from] the high place at Gibeon to Jerusalem, from before the tent of meeting, and reigned over Israel.

And Solomon gathered chariots and horsemen; and he had a thousand four hundred chariots and twelve thousand horsemen; and he placed them in the chariot-cities, and 18 with the king at Jerusalem.

the king made silver and gold in Jerusalem as stones, and cedars made he as the sycamores that are in the 16 lowland of or abundance. And the ex-

portation of horses that Solomon had was from Egypt: a caravan of the king's merchants fetched a drove of 17 horses at a price. And they fetched up and brought forth out of Egypt a chariot for six hundred shekels of silver, and a horse for a hundred and

fifty; and so they brought [them] by

their means, for all the kings of the

Hittites and for the kings of Syria. And Solomon purposed to build a house for the name of Jehovah, and \* a house for his kingdom. And Solomon numbered seventy thousand 11 men to bear burdens, and eighty thousand stone-masons in the mountain, and three thousand six hundred

to superintend them. And Solomon sent to Huram king of Tyre, saying, As thou didst deal with David my father, and didst send him cedars to build him a house to 4 dwell therein [so do for me]. Be-

hold. I build a house unto the name of Jehovah my God to dedicate it to him, to burn before him sweet incense, and for the continual arrangement [of the shewbread], and for the morning and evening burnt-offerings [and] on the sabbaths and on the new

moons, and on the set feasts of Jeho-

And now send me a man skilful to work in gold, and in silver, and in bronze, and in iron, and in purple and crimson and blue, and experienced in carving, besides the skilful men that are with me in Judah and in Jerusalem, whom David my father provided. Send me also cedar-trees. cypress-trees, and sandal-wood trees,

passed it round about. And under it was the similitude of oxen, encompassing it round about, ten in a cubit enclosing the sea round about, two rows of oxen, cast when it was cast.

4 It stood upon twelve oxen, three looking toward the north, and three looking toward the west, and three looking toward the south, and three look-

ing toward the east; and the sea was above upon them, and all their hinder 5 parts were inward. And its thickness was a hand-breadth, and its brim like

the work of the brim of a cup, with lily-blossoms; in capacity it held three thousand baths.n And he made ten lavers, and put

five on the right and five on the left, to wash in them: they rinsed in them what they prepared for the burnt-offering; and the sea was for the priests to wash in.

And he made ten candlesticks of gold according to the ordinance respecting them, and set them in the temple, five on the right hand and five on the left.

And he made ten tables, and placed them in the temple, five on the right hand and five on the left. made a hundred golden bowls.

And he made the court of the priests, and the great court,º and doors for the court.º and overlaid 10 the doors thereof with bronze. And he set the sea on the right side east-

11 ward, over against the south. Huram made the pots and the shovels and the bowls.

So Huram ended doing the work that he made for king Solomon in 13 the house of God: two pillars, and the

globes and the capitals on the ton of the pillars, two: and the two networks, to cover the two globes of the capitals which were on the top of the pillars: and the four hundred nomegranates for the two networks. two rows of pomegranates for one network, to cover the two globes of

the capitals which were upon the 14 pillars. And he made the bases, and he made the layers on the bases: 15 one sea, and the twelve oxen under And the pots, and the shovels,

and the forks, and all their instruments did Huram Abiv make king Solomon for the house of Jehovah, of 17 bright brass. In the plain q of the Jordan did the king cast them, in

the clay-ground between Succoth and 18 Zeredathah. And Solomon made all these vessels in great number; for the weight of the brass was not ascertained.

And Solomon made all the vessels that were [in] the house of God: the golden altar; and the tables whereon 20 was the shew-bread; and the candle-

sticks with their lamps to burn according to the ordinance before the oracle, of pure gold; and the flowers. and the lamps, and the tongs, of gold (it was perfect gold), and the knives, and the bowls, and the cups, and the

censers, of pure gold: and the entrance of the house, the inner foldingdoors thereof for the most holy place. and the doors of the house, of the temple, of gold.

And all the work was finished that Solomon made for the house of Jehovah. And Solomon brought in the things that David his father had dedicated; and the silver, and the gold, and all the vessels he put among the treasures of the house of God.

Then Solomon assembled the elders of Israel, and all the heads of the tribes, the princes of the fathers of the children of Israel, to Jerusalem, to bring up the ark of the covenant

of Jehovah out of the city of David, \* which is Zion. And all the men of Israel assembled themselves to the king at the feast, that of the seventh 4 month. And all the elders of Israel came: and the Levites took up the 5 ark. And they brought up the ark, and the tent of meeting, and all the holy vessels that were in the tent: the priests, the Levites, brought 6 them up. And king Solomon, and all the assembly of Israel, that were assembled to him before the ark. sacrificed sheep and oxen which could not be counted nor number-7 ed for multitude. And the priests brought in the ark of the covenant of Jehovah to its place, into the oracle of the house, into the most holy place, 8 under the wings of the cherubin; and the cherubim stretched forth [their] wings over the place of the ark, and the cherubim covered the ark and its staves above. And the staves were long. so that the ends of the staves were seen outside the ark before the oracle: but they were not seen without. And there they are to this day. 10 There was nothing in the ark save the two tables which Moses put there at Horeb, when Jehovah made [a covenant] with the children of Israel, when they came out of Egypt. 11

And it came to pass when the priests were come out of the holy place (for all the priests that were present were hallowed without observing the courses; and the Levites the singers, all they of Asaph, of Heman, of Jeduthun, with their sons and their brethren, clad in byssus, with cymbals and lutes and harps, stood at the east end of the altar, and with them a hundred and twenty priests sounding with trumpets),—it came to pass when the trumpeters and singers were as one, to make one voice to be

heard in praising and thanking Jehovah; and when they lifted up

their voice with trumpets, and cym-

bals, and instruments of music, and

praised Jehovah: For he is good, for his loving-kindness [endureth] for ever: that then the house, the house 14 of Jehovah, was filled with a cloud, and the priests could not stand to do their service because of the cloud: for the glory of Jehovah had filled the house of God. VI. Then said Solomon: Jehovah said

that he would dwell in the thick darka ness: But I have built a house of habitation for thee, even a settled place for thee to abide in for ever.

8 And the king turned his face and blessed the whole congregation of Israel; and the whole congregation of Israel stood. And he said: Blessed be Jehovah

the God of Israel, who spoke with his mouth unto David my father, and hath with his hands fulfilled it, say-5 ing. Since the day that I brought forth my people out of the land of Egypt I chose no city out of all the tribes of Israel to build a house in, that my name might be there; neither chose I any man to be prince over

my people Israel: but I have chosen Jerusalem, that my name might be there; and I have chosen David to <sup>7</sup> be over my people Israel. And it was in the heart of David my father to build a house unto the name of Jehoe val the God of Israel. But Jehovah

said to David my father, Whereas it was in thy heart to build a house unto my name, thou didst well that it was in thy heart; nevertheless thou shalt not build the house; but thy

son that shall come forth out of thy loins, he shall build the house unto 10 my name. And Jehovah has performed his word which he spoke; and I am risen up in the room of David my father, and sit on the throne of Israel, as Jeliovah promised, and

I have built the house unto the name

of Jehovah the God of Israel. in it have I put the ark, wherein is the covenant of Jehovah, which he made with the children of Israel.

Others, 'And they drew out the staves.'

And he stood before the alter of Jehovah in the presence of the whole congregation of Israel, and spread 18 forth his hands. For Solomon had made a platform of bronze, five cubits long, and five cubits broad, and three cubits high, and had set it in the midst of the court; and upon it he stood, and he kneeled down on his knees before the whole congregation of Israel, and spread forth his

14 hands toward the heavens, and said, Jehovah, God of Israel! there is no God like thee, in the heavens or on the earth, who keepest covenant and mercy with thy servants that walk before thee with all their heart: 15 who hast kept with thy servant Da-

vid my father that which thou didst

promise him; thou spokest with thy mouth, and hast fulfilled [it] with 16 thy hand as at this day. And now, Jehovah, God of Israel, keep with thy servant David my father that which thou hast promised him saying, There shall not fail thee a man in my sight to sit on the throne of Israel, if only thy sons take heed to

their way to walk in my law, as thou 17 hast walked before me. And now, Jehovah, God of Israel, let thy word be verified which thou hast spoken 18 unto thy servant David.

God indeed dwell with man on the earth? behold, the heavens and the heaven of heavens cannot contain thee; how much less this house

19 which I have built! Yet have respect unto the prayer of thy servant, and to his supplication, Jehovah, my God, to hearken unto the cry and to the prayer which thy servant prayeth so before thee; that thine eyes may be

open upon this house day and night, upon the place in which thou hast said thou wouldest put thy name: to hearken unto the prayer which thy servant prayeth toward this place.

21 And hearken unto the supplications of thy servant, and of thy people Israel, which they shall pray toward this place, and hear thou from thy dwelling-place, from the heavens, and when thou hearest, forgive.

If a man have sinned against his neighbour, and an oath be laid upon him to adjure him, and the oath come

28 before thine altar in this house; then hear thou from the heavens, and do. and judge thy servants, requiting the wicked, to bring his way upon his own head; and justifying the righteous, giving him according to his righteousness.

And if thy people Israel be put to the worse before the enemy, because they have sinned against thee, and shall turn again and confess thy name, and pray, and make suppli-25 cation before thee in this house; then hear thou from the heavens, and for-

give the sin of thy people Israel, and bring them again unto the land that thou gavest to them and to their fathers.

When the heavens are shut up, and there is no rain, because they have sinned against thee; if they pray toward this place, and confess thy name, and turn from their sin, because thou hast afflicted them; <sup>27</sup> then hear thou in the heavens, and forgive the sin of thy servants, and of thy people Israel, when thou teachest them the good way wherein they should walk; and give rain upon thy land, which thou hast given 28 thy people for an inheritance. there be famine in the land, if there be pestilence, if there be blight or mildew, locust or caterpillar; if their enemies besiege them in the land of their gates; whatever plague or as whatever sickness there be: what prayer, what supplication soever be made by any man, or by all thy people Israel, when they shall know every man his own plague, and his own grief, and shall spread forth his 80 hands toward this house; then hear thou from the heavens, the settled place of thy dwelling, and forgive,

and render unto every man according to all his ways, whose heart thou knowest (for thou, thou only, knowest

the hearts of the children of men). <sup>81</sup> that they may fear thee, to walk in thy ways, all the days that they live upon the land which thou gavest

unto our fathers. And as to the stranger also, who is not of thy people Israel, but cometh

out of a far country for thy great name's sake, and thy mighty hand and thy stretched-out arm; when

they shall come and pray toward 88 this house, then hear thou from the heavens, the settled place of thy dwelling, and do according to all that the stranger calleth to thee for: in order that all peoples of the earth may know thy name, and may fear thee as do thy people Israel, and may

know that this house which I have

built is called by thy name.

If thy people go out to battle against their enemies by the way that thou shalt send them, and they pray unto thee toward this city that thou hast chosen, and the house that <sup>85</sup> I have built unto thy name; then hear thou from the heavens their prayer and their supplication, and

maintain their right. If they have sinned against thee (for there is no man that sinneth not), and thou be angry with them, and give them up to " the enemy, and they have z carried them away cap-87 tives unto a land far off or near; and if they shall take it to heart in the

land whither they were carried captive, and repent, and make supplica-

tion unto thee in the land of their captivity, saying, We have sinned. we have done iniquity and have dealt perversely; and if they return unto thee with all their heart and with all their soul in the land of their captivity, whither they have carried

them captives, and pray toward their land which thou gavest unto their fathers, and the city that thou hast chosen, and the house that I have 89 built unto thy name; then hear thou from the heavens, from the settled

place of thy dwelling, their prayer and their supplications, and maintain their right, and forgive thy people their sin against thee. Now, my God, I beseech thee, let thine eyes be open and let thine ears

be attentive unto the prayer [that is made in this place. And now, arise, Jehovah Elohim, into thy restingplace, thou and the ark of thy strength: let thy priests, Jehovah

Elohim, be clothed with salvation. and let thy saints, rejoice in [thy] goodness.\* Jehovah Elohim, turn not away the face of thine anointed: remember mercies to David thy servant.

And when Solomon had ended praying, the fire came down from

the heavens and consumed the burntoffering and the sacrifices; and the glory of Jehovah filled the house. And the priests could not enter into the house of Jehovah, because the glory of Jehovah filled Jehovah's house. And all the children of Israel saw how the fire came down, and the glory of Jehovah upon the house, and bowed themselves with their faces to the ground on the pavement, and worshipped and thanked Jehovah:

ments of music, which David the king had made to praise Jehovah, for his loving-kindness [endureth] for ever, when David praised by their means; and the priests sounded the trumpets opposite to them, and all Israel stood. And Solomon hallowed the middle of the court that was before the house of Jehovah; for there he offered the burnt-offerings, and the fat of the peace-offerings, because the brazen altar which Solomon had made was not able to receive the burnt-offerings and the oblations and the fat.

And at that time Solomon held the feast seven days, and all Israel with him, a very great congregation, from the entrance of Hamath unto the torfent of Egypt. And on the eighth day they held a solemn assembly; for they kept the dedication of the altar seven days, and the feast seven days. And on the three and twentieth day of the seventh month he sent the people away to their tents, joyful and glad of heart for the goodness that Jehovah had done to David and to Solomon, and to Israel his people.

And Solomon completed the house of Jehovah, and the king's house; and all that came into Solomon's heart to make in the house of Jehovah, and in his own house, he did

prosperously.

Then Jehovah appeared to Solomon by night, and said to him: I have heard thy prayer, and I have chosen for myself this place for a house of sacrifice. If I shut up the heavens that there be no rain, or if I command the locust to devour the land, or if I send pestilence among my people; and my people, who are called by my name, humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from the heavens, and forgive their sin, and heal their land. Now mine eyes shall be open, and mine

ears attentive to the prayer [made]

in this place; for I have now chosen and hallowed this house, that my name may be there for ever; and mine eyes and my heart shall be 17 there perpetually. And as for thee, if thou wilt walk before me, as David thy father walked, to do according to all that I have commanded thee, and wilt keep my statutes and mine ordi-18 nances, then will I establish the throne of thy kingdom, according as I have covenanted with David thy father, saying, There shall not fail 19 thee a man to rule over Israel. But if ye turn away and forsake my statutes and my commandments which I have set before you, and go and serve other gods and worship them; 20 then will I pluck them up by the roots out of my land which I have given them; and this house, which I have hallowed to my name, will I cast out of my sight, and will make it a proverb and a byword among all <sup>21</sup> peoples. And this house, which is high, shall be an astonishment to every one that passes by it; so that he shall say, Why has Jehovah done thus to this land and to this house? <sup>38</sup> And they shall say, Because they forsook Jehovah the God of their fathers, who brought them forth out of the land of Egypt, and have attached themselves to other gods, and

All the people that were left of the Hittites, and the Amorites, and the Perizzites, and the Hivites, and the Jebusites, who were not of Israel, their children that were left after them in the land, whom the children of Israel had not destroyed, upon them did Solomon impose tribute-service until this day. But of

upon them did Solomon impose tribute-service until this day. But of the children of Israel, of them did Solomon make no bondmen for his work; but they were men of war, and chief of his captains, and captains of his chariots and his horsemen.

And these were the chief of king Solomon's superintendents, two hundred and fifty, that ruled over the

people.

And Solomon brought up the daughter of Pharaoh out of the city of David to the house which he had built for her; for he said, My wife shall not dwell in the house of David king of Israel, because the [places] are holy to which the ark of Jehovah has come.

Then Solomon offered up burntofferings to Jehovah on the altar of
Jehovah, which he had built before
the porch; even as the duty of every
day required, offering according to
the commandment of Moses, on the
sabbaths, and on the new moons, and
at the set feasts, three times in the
year,—at the feast of unleavened
bread, and at the feast of weeks, and
the feast of tabernacles. And he
appointed, according to the ordinance
of David his father, the divisions of
the priests for their service, and the

mandment of David the man of God:

and they did not depart from the commandment of the king to the priests and the Levites concerning any matter, nor concerning the treasures.
And all the work of Solomon was prepared, to the day of the foundation of the house of Jehovah and to its completion. [So] the house of

Then went Solomon to Ezion-geber, and to Eloth, on the sea-shore in the land of Edom. And Huram sent him by his servants ships, and servants that had knowledge of the sea;

Jehovah was finished.

and they went with the servants of Solomon to Ophir, and fetched thence four hundred and fifty talents of gold, and brought them to king Solomon.

IX. For the king's ships went to Tarshish with the servants of Huram: once in three years came the ships of Tarshish, bringing gold and silver, ivory, and apes, and peacocks.

And king Solomon was greater than all the kings of the earth in

And Shishak king of Egypt came up against Jerusalem, and took away the treasures of the house of Jehovah. and the treasures of the king's house: he took away all; and he took away the shields of gold that Solomon had

made. And king Rehoboam made in their stead shields of bronze, and committed them to the hands of the chief of the couriers who kept the en-11 trance of the king's house. And it was so, that as often as the king entered into the house of Jehovah, the couriers came and fetched them.

and brought them again into the chamber of the couriers. And when he humbled himself, the anger of Jehovah turned away from him, that he would not destroy him altogether:

his fathers, and was buried in the city of David. And Abijah his son reigned in his stead.

XIII. In the eighteenth year of king Jeroboam began Abijah to reign over Judah. He reigned three years in Jerusalem; and his mother's name

was Michaiah, the daughter of Uriel of Gibeah. And there was war be-<sup>8</sup> tween Abijah and Jeroboam. And Abijah began the war with an army of men of war, four hundred thousand chosen men; and Jeroboam set the battle in array against him with eight hundred thousand chosen men. 4 mighty men of valour. covenant of salt? But Jeroboam the son of Nebat, the servant of Solomon the son of David, rose up and rebelled against his lord. And vain men,

sons of Belial, gathered to him and strengthened themselves against Rehoboam the son of Solomon, and

Rehoboam was young and faint-hearted, and did not shew himself strong against them. And now ve think to shew yourselves strong against the kingdom of Jehovah in

the hand of the sons of David; and ye are a great multitude, and ve have with you the golden calves that Jero-

boam made you for gods. Have ye not cast out the priests of Jehovah, the sons of Aaron, and the Levites, and made you priests as the peoples of the lands? whoever comes to con-

secrate himself with a young bullock and seven rams, he becomes a priest of what is not God." But as for us, Jehovah is our God, and we have

not forsaken him; and the priests that serve Jehovah are the sons of Aaron, and the Levites are at their 11 work: and they burn to Jehovah

every morning and every evening burnt-offerings and sweet incense: the loaves also are set in order upon the pure table; and the candlestick

of gold with its lamps to burn every evening: for we keep the charge of Jehovah our God; but ye have for-

to make ships to go to Tarshish; and
they made the ships in Ezion-geber.

And Eliezer the son of Dodavah, of Mareshah, prophesied against Jehoshaphat, saying, Because thou hast joined thyself with Ahaziah, Jehovah has broken thy works. And the ships were broken, and could not go to Tarshish.

XXI. And Jehoshaphat slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David; and Jehoram his son reigned in his stead.

And he had brethren, the sons of Jehoshaphat: Azariah and Jehiel, and Zechariah, and Azariah, and Michael, and Shephatiah: all these were sons

of Jehoshaphat king of Israel. And their father had given them great gifts of silver and of gold and of precious things, besides fortified cities in Judah; but the kingdom he gave

to Jehoram, for he was the firstborn.

And Jehoram established himself over the kingdom of his father, and strengthened himself; and he slew all his brethen with the sword and

into Judah, and broke into it. and carried away all the substance that was found in the king's house, and his sons also, and his wives; so that there was no son left him, except Jehoahaz 4 the youngest of his sons. 18 And after all this, Jehovah smote him in his bowels with an incurable sick-19 ness. And it came to pass, from day to day, and at the time when the second year was drawing to a close, that his bowels fell out by reason of his sickness, and he died in cruel sufferings. And his people made no burning for him, like the burning of 20 his fathers. He was thirty-two years old when he began to reign, and he reigned in Jerusalem eight years, and departed without being regretted. And they buried him in the city of David, but not in the sepulchres of the kings.

And the inhabitants of Jeru-XXII. salem made Ahaziah his voungest son king in his stead; for the band of men that came in the camp with the Arabians had slain all the elder And Ahaziah the son of ones. Jehoram king of Judah reigned. Ahaziah was twenty-two vears old when he began to reign; and he reigned one year in Jerusalem; and his mother's name was Athaliah. 8 daughter of Omri. He also walked in the ways of the house of Ahab:

for his mother was his counsellor to 4 do wickedly. And he did evil in the sight of Jehovah like the house of 12 that she did not slay him; and he Ahab; for they were his counsellors after the death of his father, to his

He walked also after <sup>5</sup> destruction. their counsel, and went with Jehoram the son of Ahab, king of Israel, to the war against Hazael the king of Syria at Ramoth-Gilead; and the Syrians

<sup>6</sup> wounded Joram. And he returned to be healed in Jizreel because of the wounds that were given him at Ramah, when he fought with Hazael king of Syria. And Azariah the son

of Jehoram, king of Judah, went down to see Jehoram the son of Ahab at

<sup>7</sup> Jizreel; for he was sick. coming to Joram was from God the complete ruin of Ahaziah. And when he had come, he went out with Jehoram against Jehu the son of Nimshi. whom Jehovah had anointed to cut

<sup>6</sup> off the house of Ahab. And it came to pass when Jehu was executing judgment upon the house of Ahab, that he found the princes of Judah, and the sons of the brethren of Ahaziah, that attended upon Ahaziah,

9 and he slew them. And he sought

Ahaziah; and they caught him (for he had hid himself in Samaria), and brought him to Jehu, and slew him; and they buried him, for they said, He is a son of Jehoshaphat, who sought Jehovah with all his heart. And in the house of Ahaziah there was no one who was able to [hold] the kingdom.

And when Athaliah the mother of Ahaziah saw that her son was dead. she rose up and exterminated all the royal seed of the house of Judah.

11 But Jehoshabeath the daughter of the king took Joash the son of Ahaziah and stole him from among the king's sons that were slain, and put him and his nurse in the bed-chamber. So Jehoshabeath, the daughter of king Jehoram, the wife of Jehoiada the priest (for she was the sister of Ahaziah), hid him from Athaliah, so

was with them hid in the house of God six years. And Athaliah reigned over the land.

XXIII. And in the seventh year Jehoiada strengthened himself, and took the captains of the hundreds. Azariah the son of Jeroham, and Ishmael the son of Jehohanan, and Azarish the son of Obed, and Masseiah the son of Adaiah, and Elishaphat the son of Zichri, into covenant with him. And they went about in Judah

This is the thing which ye shall do: a third part of you that come in on the sabbath, of the priests and of the Levites, shall be keepers of the doors; and a third part shall be at the king's house; and a third part at the gate of the foundation; and all the people shall be in the courts of the house of Jehovah. But let none come into the house of Je-

hovah except the priests and those of the Levites that do the service; they shall go in, for they are holy; but all the people shall keep the 7 watch of Jehovah. And the Levites shall encompass the king round about, every man with his weapons in his

hand: and he that comes into the house shall be put to death; and ye shall be with the king when he comes

in and when he goes out.

And the Levites and all Judah did according to all that Jehoiada the priest commanded; and they took every man his men, those that were to come in on the sabbath, with them that were to go forth on the sabbath; for Jehoiada the priest did not liberate the divisions. And Jehoiada the priest gave to the captains of the hundreds king David's spears and shields and targets, which were in the house 10 of God. And he set all the people, every man with his javelin in his hand, from the right side of the house to the left side of the house, toward the altar and the house, by the king 11 round about. And they brought forth the king's son, and put the crown upon him, and [gave him] the testimony, and made him king. And Jehoiada and his sons anointed him, and said, Long live the king!

And Athaliah heard the noise of

the people running and praising the king, and she came to the people 18 into the house of Jehovah. And she looked, and behold, the king stood on his dais at the entrance, and the princes and the trumpets were by the king; and all the people of the land rejoiced, and blew with trumpets; and the singers [were there] with the instruments of music, and such as taught to sing praise. And Athaliah rent her garments, and said, 14 Conspiracy! Conspiracy! And Jehoiada the priest brought out the

captains of the hundreds that were set over the host, and said to them, Lead her forth without the ranks: and whoseever follows her, let him be slain with the sword; for the

priest said. Ye shall not put her to 15 death in the house of Jehovah. And they made way for her, and she went

through the entrance of the horsegate into the king's house, and they put her to death there. And Jehoiada made a covenant between himself and all the people and the king, that they should be the people of Jehovah. And all the peo-

ple went into the house of Baal, and broke it down; and they broke his altars and his images in pieces, and slew Mattan the priest of Baal before the altars. And Jehoiada appointed the offices of the house of Jehovah

under the hand of the priests, the Levites, whom David had set by classes over the house of Jehovah to offer up Jehovah's burnt-offerings, as it is written in the law of Moses,-

with rejoicing and with singing according to the directions of David. 19 And he set the doorkeepers at the gates of the house of Jehovah, that

no one unclean in anything should enter in. And he took the captains of the hundreds, and the nobles, and the governors of the people, and all

the people of the land, and brought down the king from the house of Jehovah, and they came through the

upper gate into the king's house, and

set the king upon the throne of the kingdom. And all the people of the land rejoiced, and the city was quiet; and they had slain Athaliah with the sword.

XXIV. Joash was seven years old when he began to reign; and he reigned forty years in Jerusalem; and his mother's name was Zibiah of Beersheba. And Joash did what was right in the sight of Jehovah all the days of Jehoiada the priest. And Jehoiada took for him two wives; and he begot sons and daughters.

And it came to pass after this, that Joash was minded to renew the house of Jehovah. And he gathered together the priests and the Levites, and said to them, Go out to the cities of Judah and collect of all Israel money for the repair of the house of your God from year to year, and ye shall hasten the matter. But the Levites hastened it not. And the king called for Jehoiada the chief, and said to him, Why hast thou not

the tribute of Moses the servant of Jehovah [laid upon] the congregation of Israel, for the tent of the testimony? For the wicked Athaliah [and] her sons had devastated the house of God; and also all the hallowed things of the house of Jehovah

And the king commanded, and they made a chest, and set it at the gate of the house of Jehovah without, and they made a proclamation through Judah and Jerusalem, to bring to Jehovah the tribute of Moses the servant of God [laid upon] Israel in the wilderness. And all the princes and all the people rejoiced, and brought in and east into the chest, until they had finished.

And it came to pass at the time the chest was brought for the king's control by the hand of the Levites, and when they saw that there was much

money, the king's scribe and high priest's officer came, and they emptied the chest, and took it, and carried it to its place again. Thus they did day by day, and gathered money in abundance. And Jehoiada grew old and was full of days, and he died; he was a hundred and thirty years old when he died. And they buried him in the city of David among the kings, because he had done good in Israel, both toward God and toward his house.

And after the death of Jehoiada the princes of Judah came and made obeisance to the king; then the king hearkened to them. And they forsook the house of Jehovah the God of their fathers, and served the Asherahs and idols; and wrath came upon Judah and Jerusalem for this their trespass. And he sent prophets among them to bring them again to Jehovah, and they testified against them; but they would not give ear.

And the Spirit of God came upon Zechariah the son of Jehoiada the priest; and he stood up above the people and said unto them, Thus saith God: Wherefore do ye transgress the commandments of Jehovah? And they conspired against him, and stoned him with stones at the command of the king in the court of the house of Jehovah. And king Joash remembered not the kindness which Jehoiada his father had done to him, but slew his son. And when he died, he said, Jehovah see and require [it]!

fathers, but every man shall die for

his own sin.

And Amaziah gathered Judah together and arranged them according to the fathers' houses, according to the captains of thousands and the captains of hundreds, throughout Judah and Benjamin; and he numbered them from twenty years old and upwards, and found them three hundred thousand choice men, able for military service, that could handle spear and target. He hired also a hundred

thousand mighty men of valour out of Israel for a hundred talents of silver. But there came a man of God to him, saying, O king, let not the host of Israel go with thee; for Jehovah is not with Israel, [with] all the children of Ephraim. But if thou wilt go, do [it]; be strong for the battle: God will make thee fall before the enemy, for there is with God

And Amaziah said to the man of

But Amaziah strengthened himself, and led forth his people, and went to the valley of salt, and smote of the children of Seir ten thousand. And

And he sought God in the days of Zechariah, who had understanding in the visions of God, and in the days that he sought Jehovah. <sup>6</sup> God made him to prosper. went forth and fought against the Philistines, and broke down the wall of Gath, and the wall of Jabneh, and the wall of Ashdod, and built cities about Ashdod, and among the Philis-7 times. And God helped him against the Philistines, and against the Arabiana that dwelt in Gur-Bael. <sup>8</sup> and the Maonites. And the Ammonites gave gifts to Uzziah: and his name spread abroad to the entrance of Egypt; for he became exceeding strong. And Uzziah built towers in Jerusalem at the corner gate, and at the valley gate, and at the angle, and 10 fortified them. And he built towers in the desert and digged many cisterns; for he had much cattle, both in the lowland and on the plateau, husbandmen [also] and vinedressers on the mountains and in Carmel: 11 for he loved husbandry. And Uzziah had an army of fighting men, that went out to war by bands, according to the number of their account by the hand of Jeiel the scribe and Maaseiah the ruler, b under the hand of Hananiah, one of the king's cap-The whole number of the chief fathers of the mighty men of valour was two thousand six hun-18 dred. And under their hand was an army-host of three hundred and seven thousand five hundred, that made war with mighty power to help the 4 king against the enemy. And Uzziah prepared for them, throughout the host, shields, and spears, and helmets, and coats of mail, and bows, 15 and even slinging-stones. made in Jerusalem machines invented by skilful men, to be upon the towers and upon the bulwarks, whereAnd his name spread far abroad; for he was marvellously helped, till he became strong.

But when he became strong his heart was lifted up to [his] downfall: and he transgressed against Jehovah his God, and went into the temple of Jehovah to burn incense upon the 17 altar of incense. And Azariah the priest went in after him, and with him priests of Jehovah, eighty valiant 18 men: and they withstood Uzziah the king, and said to him, It is not for thee. Uzziah, to burn incense to Jehovah, but for the priests the sons of Aaron, that are consecrated to burn incense. Go out of the sanctuary: for thou hast transgressed; neither shall it be for thine honour from Je-19 hovah Elohim. And Uzziah was wroth: and he had a censer in his hand to burn incense; and while he was wroth with the priests, the leprosy rose up in his forehead before the priests in the house of Jehovah. 20 heside the incense altar. And Azariah the chief priest and all the priests looked upon him, and behold, he was leprous in his forehead, and they thrust him out from thence; even he himself hasted to go out, because Jehovah had smitten him. And Uzziah the king was a leper to the day of his death, and dwelt in a separate house, being a leper; for he was cut off from the house of Jehovah. And some of the chief fathers, when they came to the house of Jehovah which is at Jerusalem, offered freely

for the house of God to set it up in its place. They gave after their ability to the treasure of the work sixty-one thousand darics of gold, and five thousand pounds of silver, and one hundred priests' coats.

and [some] of the people, and the singers, and the doorkeepers, and the Nethinim dwelt in their cities,

and all Israel in their cities.

III. And when the seventh month came, and the children of Israel were in the cities, the people gathered together as one man to Jerusalem.

Then stood up Jeshua the son of

Jozadak, and his brethren the priests, and Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, and his brethren, and built the altar of the God of Israel, to offer up burntofferings on it, as it is written in the law of Moses the man of God.

And they set the altar on its base; for fear was upon them because of the people of the countries; and they offered up burnt-offerings on it to Jehovah, the morning and evening burnt-offerings. And they held the feast of tabernacles as it is written,

and [offered] daily burnt-offerings by number, according to the ordinance, as the duty of every day required;

as the duty of every day required; and afterwards the continual burntoffering, and those of the new moons,

and of all the set feasts of Jehovah that were consecrated, and of every one that willingly offered a voluntary

one that whingly offered a voluntary offering to Jehovah. From the first day of the seventh month they began to offer up burnt-offerings to Jehovah.

But the foundation of the temple of

Jehovah was not [yet] laid. And they gave money to the masons and to the carpenters; and meat and drink and oil to the Zidonians and to the Tyrians, to bring cedar-trees

from Lebanon to the sea at Joppa, according to the grant that they had of Cyrus king of Persia.

And in the second year of their coming to the house of God at Jeru-

salem, in the second month, began Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel. and Jeshua the son of Jozadak, and the remnant of their brethren the priests and the Levites, and all they that had come out of the captivity to Jerusalem; and they appointed the Levites, from twenty years old and upward, to superintend the work of the house of Jehovah. And Jeshua stood up, his sons and his brethren, Kadmiel and his sons, the sons of Judah, as one [man], to superintend the workmen in the house of God; [also] the sons of Henadad, their sons and their brethren, the Levites.

And when the builders laid the foundation of the temple of Jehovah. they set the priests in their appearel, with trumpets, and the Levites the sons of Asaph, with cymbals, to praise Jehovah according to the directions 11 of David king of Israel. And they sang alternately together in praising and giving thanks to Jehovah: For he is good, for his loving kindness [endureth] for ever toward Israel. And all the people shouted with a great shout to the praise of Jehovah. because the foundation of the house 19 of Jehovah was laid. But many of the priests and Levites and chief

house was laid in their sight; and 18 many shouted aloud for joy. And the people could not discern the noise of the shout of joy from the noise of the weeping of the people; for the people shouted with a great shout,

and the noise was heard afar off.

And the adversaries of Judah and Benjamin heard that the children of the captivity were building the temple to Jehovah the God of Israel; and they came to Zerubbabel and to the chief fathers, and said to them. We would build with you; for we seek your God, as ye; and we have sacrificed to him since the days of Esar-haddon king of Assyria, who

brought us up hither. But Zerubbabel and Jeshua and the rest of the chief fathers of Israel said to them. Ye have nothing to do with us to build a house to our God, but we alone will build to Jehovah the God

of Israel, as king Cyrus, the king of Persia, has commanded us. the people of the land weakened the hands of the people of Judah, and 5 troubled them in building; and they hired counsellors against them, to frustrate their purpose, all the days of Cyrus king of Persia, even until the reign of Darius king of Persia.

.6 And in the reign of Ahasuerus, in the beginning of his reign, they wrote an accusation against the inhabitants of Judah and Jerusalem.

the days of Artaxerxes. Bishlam. Mithredath, Tabeel, and the rest of his companions, wrote to Artaxerxes king of Persia; and the writing of the letter was written in Aramaic, and

interpreted in Aramaic. Rehum the chancellor and Shimshai the scribe wrote a letter against Jerusalem to Artaxerxes the king after this sort:

in the end it will bring damage to the

The king sent an answer to Rehum the chancellor, and Shimshai the scribe, and the rest of their companions that dwell in Samaria, and

As soon as the copy of king Artaxerxes' letter was read before Rehum, and Shimshai the scribe, and their companions, they went up in haste to Jerusalem to the Jews, and made them cease by force and power. Then ceased the work of the house

to Jerusalem to the Jews, and made them cease by force and power.

A Then ceased the work of the house of God which is at Jerusalem; and it ceased until the second year of the reign of Darius king of Persia.

V. Now the prophets, Haggai the

prophet and Zechariah the son of Iddo, prophesied to the Jews that were in Judah and Jerusalem; in the name of the God of Israel [did they prophesy] to them. Then rose up Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, and Jeshua the son of Jozadak, and began to build the house of God which is at Jerusalem; and with them were the prophets of God, who helped them.

At that time came to them Tatnai, governor on this side the river, and Shethar-boznai, and their companions, and said thus to them: Who gave you orders to build this house and to complete this wall? And they said to them after this manner: What are the names of the men that build this building? But the eye of their God was upon the elders of the Jews, and they did not make them

cease till the matter came to Darius:

and then they returned answer by letter concerning it.

The copy of the letter that Tatnai, governor on this side the river, and Shethar-boznai, and his companions the Apharsachites, who were on this side the river, sent to Darius the king. They sent a report to him in which was written thus: To Darius the

king that we went into the province of Judah, to the house of the great God, which is being built with great stones, and timber is laid in the walls. and this work is being carried on with diligence, and prospers in their hand. <sup>9</sup> Then asked we those elders: thus we said to them, Who gave you orders to build this house and to complete 10 this wall? We asked their names also, to inform thee, that we might write the names of the men that were 11 the chief of them. And thus they returned us answer, saying, We are the servants of the God of the heavens and the earth and build the house that was built these many years ago; and a great king of Israel built and com-12 pleted it. But after that our fathers had provoked the God of the heavens to wrath, he gave them into the hand of Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon, the Chaldean, and he destroyed this house, and carried the people away 18 unto Babylon. But in the first year of Cyrus king of Babylon, king Cyrus gave orders to build this house of 14 God. And the vessels also of gold and silver of the house of God, which Nebuchadnezzar took out of the temple that was at Jerusalem and brought into the temple of Babylon, those did king Cyrus take out of the temple of Babylon, and they were delivered to one Sheshbazzar by name, whom he 16 had appointed governor. And he said to him, Take these vessels, go, carry them into the temple that is at Jerusalem, and let the house of God be 16 built in its place. Then came the same Sheshbazzar, [and] laid the foundation of the house of God which is at Jerusalem; and since that time even until now has it been in building, 17 and it is not completed. And now, if it seem good to the king, let search be made in the king's treasure-house. which is there at Babylon, whether it be so, that orders were given by king Cyrus to build this house of God

his pleasure to us concerning this matter.

matter. Then king Darius gave orders, and search was made in the house of the rolls, where the treasures were 2 laid up in Babylon. And there was found at Achmetha in the fortress. that is in the province of Media a roll, and therein was a record thus written: In the first year of king Cyrus, king Cyrus made a decree b [concerning] the house of God at Jerusalem: Let the house be built for a place where they offer sacrifices, and let its foundations be solidly laid: its height sixty cubits, its breadth sixty cubits, [with] three rows of great stones, and a row of new timber, and let the expenses be given out of the king's house: and also let the golden and silver vessels of the house of God, which Nebuchadnezzar took out of the temple that is at Jerusalem and brought to Babylon, be restored and brought again to the temple that is at Jerusalem, in their place; and thou shalt put [them] in the house of God. Therefore Tatnai, governor beyond the river, Shethar-boznai, and your companions the Apharsachites, who are beyond the river, be ye far from thence: let the work of this house of God alone; let the governor of the Jews and the elders of the Jews build this house of God in its place. Moreover, I give orders what ye shall do to these elders of the Jews, for the building of this house of God: that of the king's goods, of the tribute beyond the river, expenses be diligently given to these men, that they be not hindered. And that which they have need of, both young bullocks and rams and lambs, for the burnt-offerings to the God of the heavens, wheat, salt, wine, and oil, according to the appointment of the priests that are at Jerusalem, let it be given them day by day without 10 fail; that they may present sweet odours to the God of the heavens,

at Jerusalem; and let the king send

and pray for the life of the king and 11 of his sons. Also I have given order that whosoever shall alter this rescript, let timber be pulled down from his house, and being set up, let him be hanged thereon, and let his house 12 be made a dunghill for this. ment of Cyrus, and Darius, and 1s Artaxerxes king of Persia. And this house was finished on the third day of the month Adar, which was in the sixth year of the reign of king Darius.

And the children of Israel, the priests and the Levites, and the rest of the children of the captivity, kept the dedication of this house of God with joy; and they presented at the dedication of this house of God a hundred bullocks, two hundred rams, four hundred lambs, and for a sin-offering for all Israel, twelve he-goats, according to the number of the tribes

offering for all Israel, twelve he-goats, according to the number of the tribes <sup>18</sup> of Israel. And they set the priests in their classes, and the Levites in their divisions, for the service of God, which is at Jerusalem: as it is written in the book of Moses.

And the children of the captivity held the passover upon the fourteenth

And when I heard this thing, I rent my mantle and my garment, and plucked off the hair of my head and of my beard, and sat down 4 overwhelmed. Then were assembled to me every one that trembled at the words of the God of Israel, because of the unfaithfulness of those that had been carried away; and I sat overwhelmed until the evening obla-

tion. And at the evening oblation I arose up from my humiliation; and with my mantle and my garment rent, I fell on my knees, and spread out my 6 hands to Jehovah my God, and said: O my God, I am ashamed and blush to lift up my face to thee. my God; for our iniquities are increased over [our] head, and our trespass is 7 grown up to the heavens. Since the days of our fathers, we have been in great trespass to this day; and for our iniquities we, our kings, our priests, have been given into the hand of the kings of the lands, to the sword, and to captivity, and to spoil, and to confusion of face, as <sup>8</sup> it is this day. And now for a little space there hath been favour from Jehovah our God, to leave us a remnant to escape, and to give us a nail r

## NEHEMIAH.

The words of Nehemiah the son of Hachaliah.

And it came to pass in the month Chisley, in the twentieth year, b as I was in Shushan the fortress, that Hanani, one of my brethren, came, he and [certain] men of Judah. And I asked them concerning the Jews that had escaped, who were left of the captivity, and concerning Jerusalem.

8 And they said to me. Those who remain, that are left of the captivity there in the province, are in great affliction and reproach; and the wall of Jerusalem is in ruins, and its gates

4 are burned with fire. And it came to pass, when I heard these words, that I sat and wept, and mourned for days, and fasted, and prayed before the

6 ments! Let thine ear now be attentive, and thine eyes open, to hear the prayer of thy servant, which I pray before thee at this time, day and night, for the children of Israel thy servants, confessing the sins of the children of Israel, which we have sinned against thee: both I and my

7 father's house have sinned. We have acted very perversely against thee, and have not kept the commandments, nor the statutes, nor the ordinances that thou commandedst

<sup>8</sup> thy servant Moses. Remember, I beseech thee, the word that thou commandedst thy servant Moses, saying, If ye act unfaithfully, I will

9 scatter you among the peoples; but if ye return to me, and keep my commandments and do them, though there were of you cast out unto the

uttermost part of the heavens, yet will I gather them from thence, and will bring them unto the place that I have chosen to set my name there. 10 And they are thy servants and thy

people, whom thou hast redeemed by thy great power and by thy 11 strong hand. O Lord, I beseech thee, let now thine ear be attentive to the prayer of thy servant, and to the prayer of thy servants who delight

to fear thy name; and prosper, I pray thee, thy servant this day, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man. Now I was the king's cupbearer.

And it came to pass in the month Nisan, in the twentieth year of Artaxerxes' the king, [that] wine was before him, and I took up the wine and gave it to the king. Now, I had never been sad in his presence.

And the king said to me, Why is thy face sad, seeing thou art not sick? this is nothing else but sadness of heart. And I was very sore afraid.

And I said to the king, Let the king live for ever! Why should not my countenance be sad, when the city, the place of my fathers' sepul-

chres, lies waste, and its gates are 4 consumed with fire? And the king said to me. For what dost thou make request? So I prayed to the God of

be given me to the governors beyond the river, that they may set me for-8 ward till I come into Judah: and a letter to Asaph the keeper of the

king's forest, h that he may give me timber to make beams for the gates of the palace which [appertains] to the house, and for the wall of the

city, and for the house that I shall enter into. And the king granted me, according to the good hand of my God upon me. And I came to the governors be-

yond the river, and gave them the king's letters. Now the king had sent captains of a force and horsemen 10 with me. And when Sanballat the

Horonite, and Tobijah the servant, the Ammonite, heard [of it], it grieved them exceedingly that there had come a man to seek the welfare of the children of Israel.

And I came to Jerusalem, and was 12 there three days. And I arose in the night, I and some few men with me-

but I told no man what my God had put in my heart to do for Jerusalem and there was no beast with me, ex-

18 cept the beast that I rode upon. And I went out by night by the valleygate. even toward the jackal-fountain, and to the dung-gate; and I viewed the walls of Jerusalem, which were in ruins, and its gates were con-

14 sumed with fire. And I went on to the fountain-gate, and to the king's pool: and there was no place for the

15 beast under me to pass. And I went up in the night through the valley,1 and viewed the wall, and turned back, and entered by the valley-gate 16 and returned. And the rulers m did

not know whither I went or what I did, for I had not as yet told it to the Jews, nor to the priests, nor to the nobles, nor to the rulers," nor to the rest that did the work.

And I said to them, Ye see the distress that we are in, that Jerusalem lies waste, and its gates are burned with fire. Come, and let us build up the wall of Jerusalem, that we be no 18 more a reproach. And I told them of the hand of my God which had been good upon me; as also of the king's words which he had said unto me. And they said. Let us rise up and build. And they strengthened their hands for the good [work].

And Sanballat the Horonite, and Tobijah the servant, the Ammonite. and Geshemn the Arabian, heard it: and they mocked us and despised us, and said, What is this thing which ye do? will ye rebel against the king? And I answered them, and said to them. The God of the heavens. he will prosper us, and we his servants will arise and build; but ye have no portion, nor right, nor me-

morial in Jerusalem. III. And Eliashib the high priest rose up with his brethren the priests, and they built the sheep-gate. hallowed it, and set up its doors : and they hallowed it even to the tower of Meah, to the tower of Hananeel. And next to them built the men

of Jericho. And next to them built Zaccur the son of Imri.

And the fish-gate did the sons of Senaah build: they laid its beams, and set up its doors, its locks and its bars.

And next to them repaired Meremoth the son of Urijah, the son of Koz. And next to them repaired Meshullam the son of Berechiah, the son of Meshezabeel. And next to them repaired Zadok the son of Baana. And next to them the Tekoites repaired: but their nobles put not their necks to the work of their Lord. And the gate of the old [wall] re-

their stone wall.—Hear, our God,

for we are despised, and turn their reproach upon their own head, and give them for a prey' in a land of captivity! And cover not their iniquity, and let not their sin be blotted out

from before thee; for they have provoked the builders. But we built the wall; and all the wall was joined together to the half thereof; for the people had a minds to work.

And it came to pass, when Sanballat, and Tobijah, and the Arabians, and the Ammonites, and the Ashdodites heard that the walls of Jerusalem were being repaired, that the breaches began to be stopped, then  they were very wroth, and conspired all of them together to come to fight against Jerusalem, and to hinder
 it. Then we prayed to our God, and set a watch against them day and

it. Then we prayed to our God, and set a watch against them day and night, because of them. And Judah said, The strength of the bearers of burdens faileth, and there is much

rubbish; so that we are not able to 11 build at the wall. And our adversaries said, They shall not know, neither see, till we come into the midst of them and kill them, and put an end 12 to the work. And it came to pass

that when the Jews that dwelt by them came and told us so ten times, from all the places whence they re
18 turned to us, I set in the lower places behind the wall in exposed places, I even set the people, according to their families, with their swords, 14 their spears and their bows. And I looked, and rose up, and said to the nobles, and to the rulers, and to the

rest of the people, Be not afraid of them: remember the Lord who is

great and terrible, and fight for your brethren, your sons and your daughters, your wives and your houses.

And it came to pass that when our enemies heard that it was known to us, and that God had defeated their counsel, we returned all of us to the

wall, every one to his work. And from that time forth the half of my servants wrought in the work, and the other half of them held the spears, and the shields, and the captains were behind all the house of Judah. They that built on the wall, and they that bore burdens, with those that loaded, wrought in the work with one hand, and with the other they held a wes-

one his sword girded by his side, and built. And he that sounded the frumpet was by me. And I said to

ye not to walk in the fear of our God, so as not to be the reproach of the nations our enemies? I also, my brethren and my servants, we might exact usury of them, money and corn. I pray you, let us leave off this usury.

11 Restore, I pray you, to them this very day q their fields, their vineyards, their olive-gardens, and their houses, also the hundredth [part] of the money, and of the corn, the wine and the oil, that ye have exacted of 15 them. And they said, We will restore [them], and will require nothing of them; so will we do, as thou hast said. And I called the priests, and took an oath of them, that they should do according to this promise. I shook my lap, and said, So God shake out every man from his house and from his earnings, that performeth not this promise: even thus be he shaken out and emptied! all the congregation said, Amen!

And they praised Jehovah. And the people did according to this promise.

Moreover from the time that I was appointed to be their governor in the land of Judah, from the twentieth year even to the thirty-second year of Artaxerxes the king, twelve years, I and my brethren have not eaten the bread of the governor. But the

And it came to pass in the days of Ahasuerus (that is, the Ahasuerus that reigned from India even to Ethiopia, over a hundred and twenty-seven provinces), in those days, when the king Ahasuerus sat on the throne of his kingdom, which was in Shushan the fortress, in the third year of his reign, he made a feast to all his princes and his servants; the power of Persia and Media, the nobles and the princes of the provinces being before him; when he shewed the glorious wealth of his kingdom and the splendid magnifi-

And when these days were expired, the king made a feast to all the people that were present in Shushan the fortress, both to great and small, seven days, in the court

And the king said to him, What is to be done with the man whom the king delights to honour? Now Haman thought in his heart, To whom would the king delight to 7 do honour more than to me? And Haman answered the king, For the man whom the king delights to honour, let the royal apparel be brought with which the king arrays himself, and the horse that the king rides upon, and on the head of which the royal crown is set; and let the apparel and horse be delivered into the hand of one of the king's most noble princes, and let them array the man whom the king delights to honour, and cause him to ride on the horse through the street of the city, and proclaim before him, shall it be done to the man whom 10 the king delights to honour! And the king said to Haman, Make haste, take the apparel and the horse, as thou hast said, and do so to Mordecai the Jew, who sits at the king's gate: let nothing fail of all that thou 11 hast said. held my tongue, although the adversary could not compensate the king's damage. And king Ahasuerus spoke and said to Esther the queen, Who is he, and where is he that has filled his heart to do so? And Esther said, The adversary and

And Esther said, The adversary and enemy is this wicked Haman. Then Haman was terrified before the king in his wrath rose up from the banquet of wine, [and went] into the palace garden; but Haman stayed to make request for his life to Esther the queen, for he saw that there was evil determined against him by the king. And the king returned out

of the banquet of wine, and Haman was fallen upon the couch on which Esther was. And the king said, Will he even force the queen before me in the house? The word went forth out of the king's mouth, and they covered Haman's face. And

And the king took off his ring, which he had taken from Haman, and gave it to Mordecai. And Esther set Mordecai over the house of Haman.

And Esther spoke vet again before

the king, and fell down at his feet, and besought him with tears to put away the mischief of Haman the Agagite, and his device which he had 4 devised against the Jews. king held out the golden sceptre toward Esther. And Esther arose <sup>5</sup> and stood before the king, and said, If it please the king and if I have found grace before him, and the thing seem right to the king, and I be pleasing in his sight, let it be written to reverse the letters devised by Haman the son of Hammedatha the Agagite, which he wrote to destroy the Jews that are in all the king's <sup>6</sup> provinces. For how shall I endure to see the evil that shall befall my people? and how shall I endure to see the destruction of my kindred? <sup>7</sup> And king Ahasuerus said to queen Esther and to Mordecai the Jew. Behold, I have given Esther the house of Haman, and him they have hanged upon the gallows, because he stretched forth his hand against the

Then were the king's scribes called at that time, in the third month, that is, the month Sivan, on the three and twentieth [day] thereof; and it was written according to all that Mordecai commanded, to the Jews, and to the satraps, and the governors, and the princes of the provinces which are from India even to Ethiopia, a hundred and twenty-seven provinces, to every province according to the writing thereof, and to every people according to their language, and to the Jews according to their writing and 10 according to their language. And he wrote in the name of king Ahasuerus, and sealed [it] with the king's ring,

and sent letters by couriers on horseback riding on coursers, horses of blood reared in the breeding studes:" [stating] that the king granted the Jews that were in every city to gather themselves together, and to stand for

their life, to destroy, to slay, and to cause to perish all the power of the people and province that might assault them, [their] little ones and women, and to [take] the spoil of

them for a prey, upon one day in all the provinces of king Ahasuerus, upon the thirteenth of the twelfth month, that is, the month Adar. That the

decree might be given in every province, a copy of the writing was published to all the peoples, and that the Jews should be ready against that day to avenge themselves on their

4 enemies. The couriers mounted on coursers [and] horses of blood went out, being hastened and pressed on by the king's commandment. And the decree was given at Shushan the

fortress.

And Mordecai went out from the presence of the king in royal apparel of blue and white, and with a great crown of gold, and with a mantle of byssus and purple; and the city of Shushan shouted and was glad. The Jews had light, and joy, and gladness,

and in every city, wherever the king's commandment and his decree came. the Jews had joy and gladness, a feast and a good day. And many among the peoples of the land became Jews: for the fear of the Jews had

fallen upon them. IX. And in the twelfth month, that is, the month Adar, on the thirteenth day thereof, when the king's commandment and his decree drew near to be put in execution, in the day that the enemies of the Jews hoped to have power over them (but it was turned to the contrary, that the Jews had power over them \* that hated them), the Jews gathered themselves together in their cities throughout the provinces of king Ahasuerus, to lay hand on such as sought their hurt. And no man could withstand them; for the fear of them b had fallen upon all the peoples. And all the princes of the provinces, and the satraps, and the governors and officers of the king, helped the Jews; for the fear of Mordecai had fallen 4 upon them. For Mordecai was great in the king's house, and his fame went forth throughout the provinces; for the man Mordecai became con-<sup>5</sup> tinually greater. And the Jews smote all their enemies with the stroke of the sword and slaughter and destruction, and did what they 6 would to those that hated them. And in Shushan the fortress the Jews slew and destroyed five hundred men.

it be granted to the Jews that are in

Shushan to do to-morrow also according to this day's decree, and let Haman's ten sons be hanged upon 14 the gallows. And the king commanded it so to be done: and the decree was given at Shushan; and they 16 hanged Haman's ten sons. And the Jews that were in Shushan gathered themselves together on the fourteenth

day also of the month Adar and slew three hundred men at Shushan: but they laid not their hand on the prey. 16 And the other Jews that were in the king's provinces gathered themselves together, and stood for their life, and had rest from their enemies: and they slew of them that hated them seventyfive thousand (but they laid not their

17 hand on the prey), on the thirteenth day of the month Adar; and on the fourteenth of the same they rested, and made it a day of feasting and joy. 18 But the Jews that were at Shushan gathered themselves together on the thirteenth [day] thereof and on the

And Mordecai wrote these things, and sent letters to all the Jews near and far that were in all the provinces <sup>21</sup> of king Ahasuerus, to establish [this] among them, that they should keep the fourteenth day of the month Adar, and the fifteenth day of the same, yearly, as the days on which

the Jews rested from their enemies, and the month that was turned to them from sorrow to joy, and from mourning into a good day; that they

mourning into a good day; that they should make them days of feasting and joy, and of sending portions one to another and gifts to the

one to another and gifts to the poor.

And the Jews undertook to do as

they had begun, and as Mordecai had written to them. For Haman the son of Hammedatha the Agagite,

the son of Hammedatha the Agagite, the oppressor of all the Jews, had devised against the Jews to destroy

devised against the Jews to destroy them, and had cast Pur, that is, the lot, to consume them and to destroy them; and when [Esther] came be-

fore the king, he commanded by letters that his wicked device, which he had devised against the Jews, should return upon his own head; and they hanged him and his sons

26 on the gallows. Therefore they called these days Purim after the name of Pur. Therefore, according to all the words of this letter, and for

all the words of this letter, and for what they had seen concerning this matter and what had happened to <sup>27</sup> them, the Jews ordained and took

upon them, and upon their seed, and upon all such as joined themselves to them, so that it should not fail, that they would observe these two days according to their writing and

days according to their writing and according to their fixed time, every se year; and that these days should be remembered and observed throughevery province, and every city, and that these days of Purim should not fail from among the Jews, nor the memorial of them cease from among their seed.

Abihail, and Mordecai the Jew, wrote with all authority to confirm this second letter of Purim. And he sent letters to all the Jews, to the hundred and twenty-seven provinces of the kingdom of Ahasuerus, words

at of peace and truth, to confirm these days of Purim in their fixed times, according as Mordecai the Jew and queen Esther had enjoined them, and as they had decreed for themselves and for their seed, as to the

matters of the fastings and their cry.

88 And the decree of Esther confirmed these matters of Purim; and it was written in the book.

K. And king Ahasuerus laid a tribute upon the land and the isles of the sea. And all the acts of his power and of his might, and the declaration of the greatness of Mordecai, to which the king advanced him, are they not

the king advanced him, are they not written in the book of the chronicles of the kings of Media and Persia? For Mordecai the Jew was second to king Ahasuerus, and great among the Jews, and accepted of the multi-tude of his brethren, seeking the welfare of his people, and speaking peace to all his seed.
